Matthew 11:2-10

The presence of Jesus has always given rise to questions in the gospels. Who is he? Is he the messiah we have been waiting for? Who gives him all this authority? So many questions! Yet Jesus should be the answer: God's answer to humanity's need for justice, for mercy, the certainty of the presence of God's blessing, the light that shines in the darkness. Instead, Jesus is the source of questions, the reason for openness to the new that comes into the world and into one's life in a disruptive way. So, for this Christmas, let us make our own the question

of the Baptist who asked Jesus if he is really the one they were waiting for. Is Jesus the saviour we have been waiting for? Is our image of God confirmed by the coming of Jesus, or is Jesus something totally different?

Jesus represents a break from the 'normal' faith of his time, on the one hand he confirms ancient prophecies, on the other hand he is a great surprise. And where do we stand? Do we still know how to be interrupted by the presence of Jesus? He does not come to confirm our faith, our needs, he comes to interrupt us and set us on a new and unexpected path. To venture before the cradle of the nativity first, and to the cross afterwards, is to accept that we are caught up in God's plan that overturns all our plans, all our pretensions and superiority.

Jesus reveals himself in our boundaries, in the interruptions of normal life, along paths we had not planned, he is the light that illuminates our darkest areas and gives us a new life of peace and hope. May God still call us, still interrupt our normality and surprise us, fill our lives with wonder because he is truly the one we have been waiting for. Amen.



#### **CONTRIBUTIONS**

Dear sisters and brothers,

as you well know, among the many commitments that affect the management of our church there is also that of covering the costs of our church activities, and to achieve this we need your fundamental help, which manifests itself in the sending of contributions.

We have lived through the pandemic years that have reduced the financial resources of the churches, and we know that many of them are in increasing straits, but none the less we know that all of you do and will do your utmost. Despite this, however, we note that as of 30 November (and in the months leading up to it) there has been a reduction, albeit minimal, in what has been received compared to the same date last year, but we are confident that this is only a temporary situation and that, at the end of the year, we can reach and exceed what was sent in 2022. However, we note that, to date, churches are far from the targets set (minus 260,000 euro in November).

Knowing that many churches receive and send most of their contributions towards the end of the year, we urge you to make the greatest possible effort to reach the set targets, in the certainty that the Lord will also help us in this further service to which, as believers and church members, we are called and to which we have committed ourselves.
