The dawn from on high will visit us. This is not a takenfor-granted word we receive from God, it is a promise that leaves no way out, it is a sentence of freedom, love and hope that overturns every obviousness. The Christmas gospel is often turned into a romantic comforting tale, here the gospel becomes a 'familyoriented' message, it looks like a winter painting where a serene family is sitting on a sofa in front of the fireplace in a house decorated for Christmas while the snow is falling heavily outside and it is cold. Instead, even these Gospel stories contain within themselves the disruptive power of the whole Gospel. Holding on to this familiar image, we might say that the gospel is not that warm room and atmosphere sweetened by good food. The Gospel is behind the window, beyond the glass, in the cold of the night snow, it is there that the word of the Gospel is found, which comes to make all things new starting from what is not quite so reassuring: a young woman at risk of being stoned to death for adultery, a fragile infant born in an unsuitable place and without a home amongst the lowliest people on earth, a family forced to flee to a foreign land as they were being persecuted by the ruler of the time, the proclamation of peace is brought, therefore, on a night where everyone has no place except in front of Jesus.

The gospel is in the night, the light shines in the darkness, the promise is uttered while the dawn is yet to come, the resurrection must pass through the cross.

#### FROM ABROAD



All We Can have launched an emergency appeal in response to the severe droughts unfolding in East Africa.

Over 36 million people in the Horn of Africa (including Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia) are currently experiencing persistent and severe drought conditions, which, in tandem with other stressors, are causing a humanitarian situation.

In September this year, the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, Martin Griffiths, stated that "Famine will happen in Somalia and we fear that it won't be the only place either".

Forecasts predict a below-average fifth consecutive rainy season from October to December this year in parts of these countries.

The causes are multiple, with the current drought compounding the issue: In Somalia, flooding, locust infestation, displacements and persistent conflict all contribute to the current food insecurity concerns.

Communities across the region face the increased threat of famine in 2023.

All We Can, in conjunction with our humanitarian partners in East Africa, have launched an emergency appeal to respond to this crisis.

## **Ministry Fund**

During 2022, the churches fully resumed their church activities, which had dropped in part during the pandemic, and this also had a beneficial effect on the contributions sent to the OPCEMI to support these activities. In fact, at the end of November, we noted a slight increase in contributions compared to the same period last year. For this encouraging sign, the CP OPCEMI is grateful to the Lord, the churches and all the brothers and sisters who work to collect contributions. But we must point out that we are still below the contributions we received in the pre-pandemic period, and above all we are far from the figure required for 2022 (minus EUR 188,000). This in a year that sees an increase in the costs we have to meet for our activities (pastor trips, transfers, commissions, Assembly/Synod, ETC) due to the restart of activities in presence. It is therefore necessary for churches to make every effort to try to meet their targets so that they can sustain their activities as best they can and prevent having to close the budget with another deficit.
